

State Welfare Organization's mission

The missions of the Welfare Organization are as follows:

- Support and rehabilitation of the blind.
- Support and rehabilitation of the deaf.
- Support and empowerment of the mentally handicapped.
- Support and rehabilitation of the physically disabled and spinal cord injury.
- Support and rehabilitation of the elderly.
- Support and rehabilitation of chronic mental patients.
- Support and rehabilitation of normal children.
- Support and empowerment of self-employed and female-headed households.
- Support and rehabilitation of orphans and orphans.
- Support and rehabilitation of street and abused children.
- Support and rehabilitation of asylum-seeking girls (fugitives).
- Support and rehabilitation of women asylum seekers.
- Support and rehabilitation of socially disadvantaged women.
- Support and rehabilitation of addicts.
- Support and rehabilitation of people at risk of social harm (women seeking divorce, children at risk of child abuse, dysfunctional families, people who have attempted suicide, etc.).
- Re-education of social deviants and social support for them.
- Helping to provide the necessary dowry for orphans, the disabled and the needy.

- Support and care for the disabled.
- Putting the needy covered by health insurance.
- Manufacturing artificial limbs and medical shoes needed by the disabled through the organization's technical and orthopedic centers
- Preparation and development of standards for specialized rehabilitation services and monitoring their proper implementation.
- Prevention of various disabilities through the implementation of various programs and projects in the country.
- Prevention of social harms (child abuse, suicide, spousal abuse, divorce, etc.) through social services emergencies and divorce prevention centers and help clinics and hotline ١٢٣ Social emergency and face-to-face counseling centers and voice counselor ١٤٨ genetic counseling services.
- Prevention of community-based addiction in urban and rural areas, administrative, labor and educational units.
- Implementation of harm reduction programs and health, social, addiction and prevention of the spread of AIDS in the country through education of high-risk addicts and their families, distribution of preventive devices, setting up DIC and methadone clinics.
- Training life skills (individual and social) in educational units, workers and families and couples in order to strengthen individuals against the threats of social harm.
- Preparation and compilation of tariffs for consulting and preventive services and monitoring their proper implementation in the centers.
- Training of specialized human resources needed by the community in the fields of rehabilitation, health, treatment, social through the University of Social Welfare and Rehabilitation Sciences.

- Special education for the disabled such as the deaf, the mentally handicapped, Braille training and orientation for the blind
- Training life skills for the disabled.
- Assessing and guiding the jobs of the disabled for proper education and employment.
- Planning and providing opportunities for attracting public participation (cash and non-cash).
- Planning and providing opportunities to attract and attract voluntary services.
- Development of charitable and non-governmental organizations, their support and empowerment (issuance of agreement in principle, operation and supervision).
- Cultural and extracurricular programs for the disabled and people covered.
